Bus Stop Safety Reminder



Thank you, parents, for helping us teach our students about safety at the bus stop before and after school. We would like to clarify a policy

about the afternoon bus drop off routine that can sometimes be confusing.

Q>I always meet my kindergartener at the bus stop after school. One day I was running late and missed the drop off. Because I was not there, the driver took my child back to school for me to pickup there. Will that always be the plan?

A>No. It may be that your child was afraid because you were not there and dispatch was unable to contact you. Returning a child to school is not always an option, depending on the time of day or whether or not we can reach the parent by phone. Here are the general guidelines our conscientious drivers follow to ensure the well being of our students:

If a student, regardless of age, is normally met at the bus stop and no one is there when it's time to release the student, the driver will notify dispatch to help determine what steps to take; If a student regardless of age, is frightened or unsure about getting off at his or her assigned stop, the driver will not release the child. The driver will contact dispatch and relay the student's concerns, and dispatch will help determine what steps to take.

This is another reason why it is important to keep the school notified of your current telephone numbers. We hope this helps to clarify this type of situation.
